GRAND KNIGHT REPORT (Ted Buczacki): CORRESPONDENCE

- A **thank you note** from Mary Ann Albertini, advancement director of **A Woman's Concern**, for the council's \$1,000 sponsorship of the pro-life organization's Annual Partners' Event coming up April 29 at Calvary Church. The council received recognition in the event program and social media and event visuals and reserved seating at the event.
- Easter cards from Lancaster Catholic High School and Cross Catholic Outreach.

TREASURER REPORT (Buzz Anspach): All beginning balances as of 03/14/2023, ending 04/10/2023.

• **Council general fund:** Beginning balance of \$3,954.29 saw inflows totaling \$3,504.13 (COAL tickets, dues and Easter candy sales) and outflows totaling

- \$2,500.80 (mostly product for Easter candy sales and COAL tickets) for a current balance of **\$4,957.62**.
- **Church fund:** Beginning balance of \$1,275.25 gained 1 cent interest for a current balance of **\$1,275.26**.
- **Scholarship fund:** Beginning balance of \$5,491.97 gained 5 cents interest for a current balance of \$5,492.02.
- **Relief fund:** Beginning balance of \$3,375.51 gained 3 cents interest for a current balance of \$3,375.54.

DISTRICT DEPUTY REPORT (Dick Reehling)

The District Deputy:

- Offered greetings from K of C leaders.
- Congratulated the council for having so many, about 30, at the meeting and for being such an active and engaged council.
- Read an excerpt from Matthew Kelly's book "Holy Moments" from pages 30 and 31: "The definition of transfiguration is a complete change of appearance into a more beautiful spiritual state. Each Holy Moment is a mini-transfiguration. Holy Moments allow us to see what is possible, even if only for a fleeting moment. Each Holy Moment reveals who you are capable of being, and who you are capable of being is amazing. ... God is never more than once choice away. ... The rest of your life is waiting for you. It will be filled with moments. Will they be Holy Moments or unholy moments? The choice is yours."

INSURANCE REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT (JON DEAKIN):

- Noted the upcoming **Fraternal Benefit night**, **Wednesday**, **April 26**, **at** 7:30, featuring Jim Effner, with fantastic information and a chance to work toward Star council by having enough council attendees (let the Grand Knight know if you attend).
- Thanked the council for its support in helping him being named Field Agent of the Year.
- Requested that the council come up with **a list of topics** we would you like discussed in future presentations. What are your areas of concern for financial planning advice?

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Golf Outing (Dick Reehling and Jerry Sauers): Event to be held Oct. 13, 1 p.m., at Overlook. Will have a flier ready soon. Members encouraged to support this fundraiser by getting sponsors (still needed) and playing golf.

Pig Roast (Jerry Sauers): Having a second roaster delivered soon; the council will now have two roasters. The event is Aug. 20.

Pig Roast and Golf Outing meetings (Jerry Sauers): The two will be paired on an upcoming evening. Details to come.

Baptismal Rose (**Al Stamp):** One so far this month, three this weekend, one more at the end of the month.

Pro-life (Dave Edgar):

- Lots of bad news recently:
 - Wisconsin Supreme Court won by a pro-abortion judge, tilting the majority in favor of abortion.
 - Colorado legislature considering bill to ban pregnancy centers from giving out abortion-reversal medication.
 - o Massachusetts' governor demands that pharmacies sell abortion drugs.
 - o New Mexico abortion clinic sets goal of 75 abortions per week.
 - Wyoming judge blocks law that bans abortion.
- **Mifepristone and the FDA:** FDA violated its own rules when it approved the drug for abortion in 2000, using an accelerated approval process reserved for drugs that treat "serious, life-threatening illnesses," thus treating pregnancy as an illness.

• Planned Parenthood:

- The Lancaster clinic has not received transfer agreements from any of the four local hospitals, although UPMC and LGH do refer women to Planned Parenthood on their websites.
- Planned Parenthood did get an exemption from the state Department of Health, so if a woman has a serious reaction to abortion-inducing drugs, she's on her own.
- Members encouraged to **keep praying** for life.
- Carnation sales (Larry Beat): Will seek volunteers at the next meeting for sales on Mother's Day, May 14. Larry called this a wonderful fundraiser for A Woman's Concern and a good family activity, with children picking out a carnation for Mom; children also welcome to help sell. Saturday, May 13: If anyone can help, Larry needs three or four guys to pick up the flowers at Costco.
- **Great crowd (Larry Beat):** A terrific turnout at Stations of the Cross on Good Friday. Jack Schuring estimated close to 300 people attended.

Membership (Al Stamp):

Action item: Council voted to accept the following new or transfer members:
Ed Blackburn and Lou Castagna, both present and given a round of applause;
Hugh Rocks, Pedro Morales and Michael Aument.

• Exemplification (Larry Beat): Tentatively scheduled for Sunday, June 25, 2 to 5 p.m. here at St. John Neumann.

5th **Sunday Rosary:** Next is this month, April 29-30. The signup sheet was passed around at the meeting.

Baby bottles campaign (Scott Lee): Our council is by far A Woman's Concern's No. 1 donor. This year's campaign distributed 382 bottles, with 283 returned and **just over \$10,000 raised**. The Grand Knight thanked Scott for organizing the effort and Scott thanked those who passed out and collected bottles.

Grounds (Jerry Sauers): Thanked everyone who helped mulching in the rain and the evening. The Grand Knight said the church looked great for Easter as a result.

Easter candy (Ray Horan): Expressed disappointment in the effort this year. Various factors – the lack of someone taking the reins, few volunteers at Masses, having only one Sunday to sell in the narthex, the cost of product and competing with St. John Neumann School – led to this fundraiser earning only \$400 or \$500, or about half what it raised last year. Ray stated he would not run it next year, that switching to Evans for product could make a candy sale twice as big a fundraiser and it might be time to switch to Valentine's Day or Christmas or some other holiday so as not to compete with the school. The Grand Knight said that anyone who wants to take over this fundraiser will have the council's support.

COAL Tickets (Buzz Anspach): As of the start of the meeting, 281 tickets had been sold to date; with Brandon Kreiser's sales added at the meeting, probably will total more like 330 or 340. Thanks to those who purchased tickets. **All tickets must be returned to Buzz by April 20**. Drawing is May 5 at the state convention in Harrisburg.

UPCOMING EVENTS

- **April 13, Pro-life stations:** This **Thursday** after the 9 a.m. Mass; will be outside, weather-permitting.
- **April 15, Memorial Mass for Fourth Degree members** who have passed away set for 5 p.m. at St. Philip the Apostle in Millersville.
- **April 22, Purple and Gold gala**: Fundraiser for **Lancaster Catholic High School** at Lancaster Country Club. John Beck stated he still has a ticket for this sold-out event and would like for a Knight to fill out the table that will bear the council's name. Cost is \$75/person.

OLD BUSINESS

Statue(s) for the Grove Near the Outdoor Stations (Tom Carr): Not having heard back from St. Charles Seminary about the St, John Neumann statue, Tom recalled a conversation he had with Father Dan about what kind of statue he would like to see in the Stations' horseshoe. Father Dan wanted a Pieta and Tom has found one: A Pieta made of Fiberglass, 42 inches high. 38 inches wide. The total cost for delivery and materials for a pedestal and other items: \$3,000. Father Dan said the church would provide half the cost if the council could fund the other half.

Proposal: Make it a council work project to build a retaining wall a pedestal 2 to 2 ½ feet off the ground; and plant some azaleas near it.

Discussion: Council has \$1,275 in the church fund now and with the Pig Roast and Golf Outing, we can easily raise the rest of the council's \$1,500 share. A plaque recognizing the Knights' contribution? Could put a plaque but that will be discussed later.

Action item: Council unanimously approved going ahead with the project and working out the details later.

Also (Tom Carr): We should run an ad giving parishioners a chance to purchase memorial trees (at \$175 each) as we still have room for more; Tom would like to see some evergreens to, along with the Pieta, make the Outdoor Stations a beautiful prayer and meditation area. Small bricks also available for purchase.

NEW BUSINESS

Officers needed (Grand Knight): Urged members to prayerfully consider accepting the role of **Grand Knight** or **Deputy Grand Knight** for the upcoming fraternal year that begins July 1. Still no candidates for these key posts.
