Minutes: The reading of the minutes of the May 9, 2023, General Council meeting was waived. Minutes approved by unanimous voice vote.

GRAND KNIGHT REPORT (Ted Buczacki):

- Correspondence
 - A thank you letter from Jill B. Hartman, executive director of **A Woman's Concern**, addressed to Larry Beat for our **Mother's Day carnation sale**, which raised \$1,034.38 at St. John Neumann for the pro-life organization and a combined \$4,223.38 at St. Anthony of Padua and St Mary's in Lancaster, SJN, and St. Catherine of Siena in Quarryville. Larry Beat, who organized the purchase of the flowers at Costco for all four churches, thanked everyone who helped with the sale at St. John Neumann and saluted the other churches for teaming up with SJN.
 - A letter from Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly addressed to Ray Horan in recognition of the council's support of the Knights' nationwide Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP) program to "safeguard life in every stage and condition." The Grand Knight noted the \$200 check enclosed with the letter, representing Supreme's 20% match of the table the council purchased at A Woman's Concern's fundraising banquet. The Grand Knight noted that he will submit a request for an additional match

of \$200 for the Mother's Day carnation sale, which will maximize Supreme's offer of 20% of up to \$2,000 of what the council raises for the pro-life cause. The Grand Knight noted that Council 12532 will reach the maximum \$400 match with these two efforts.

TREASURER REPORT (Buzz Anspach): All beginning balances as of 05/9/2023, ending 06/12/2023.

- Council general fund: Beginning balance of \$4,827.12 saw receipts totaling \$3,360.96 and disbursements totaling \$2,552.01 for a current balance of \$5,636.07. The Treasure noted that the carnation sale accounted for most of the money in and out for the month. The most notable inflows were \$1,100 in sponsorships for the Golf Outing.
- **Church fund:** Beginning balance of \$1,275.27 gained 1 cent interest for a current balance of **\$1,275.28**.
- Scholarship fund: Beginning balance of \$5,492.07 gained 5 cents interest for a current balance of \$5,492.12. The Grand Knight noted that the \$1,000 budgeted, \$500 each for scholarships to St. John Neumann School and Lancaster Catholic High School, can be written at the next officers' meeting.
- **Relief fund:** Beginning balance of \$3,375.57 gained 3 cents interest for a current balance of \$3,375.60.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY REPORT (Ray Horan)

Service Hours were recorded for May.

DISTRICT DEPUTY REPORT (Dick Reehling)

- Offered greetings from State Deputy Michael Kish and Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly.
- The outgoing district deputy also:
 - Called it a "true honor" to have started in Council 12532, to have served as Grand Knight here and then to have gotten the chance to work with this council and the rest in the district as District Deputy, **calling the opportunity "a real pleasure."**
 - Called on the council to equally support his successor, past Grand Knight John Radicone, when he takes over as District Deputy in July.
 - o Said: "It's a blessing to be with you. Thank you for all your support. God bless you all." And he promised to continue to support the council's work.
 - The Grand Knight thanked and the council applauded the District Deputy for his willingness to do the work of the role, which he noted, involves a lot of running around.
