## GRAND KNIGHT REPORT (Ted Buczacki):

- Correspondence
  - Thank-you note from the St. John Neumann chapter of the **Society of St. Vincent de Paul** for the council's financial support.
  - Thank-you letter from Helen Sajer, president, Pennsylvania Wounded Warriors, for the \$200 donation from this year's Pig Roast. The note included the following handwritten note: "Your gift comes at a time of the greatest amount of requests for help. We have helped almost 17,000 veterans who found themselves in a financial crisis. Blessings to all of you."

    School, for the donation of \$500 from this year's Pig Roast, which included a reference to the parable of the mustard seed (Faith Planted –

"Demand for our services is higher than ever, and the numbers tell the tale: 100,000 food and clothing distributions to clients; 1.2 million pounds of food processed; 304 unsheltered clients served; 80,000 hours of outreach support shared; 10,000 hours of volunteer service provided."
- Thank-you letter from Jill B. Hartman, executive director, A Woman's Concern ("a pro-life, pro-family" organization), for the \$500 donation from this year's Pig Roast, which "helps us to make a lasting impact on families in our area through our medical services, educational programs, material assistance, and so much more!"

**TREASURER REPORT (Buzz Anspach):** All beginning balances as of 09/12/2023, ending 10/09/2023.

- **Council general fund:** Beginning balance of \$9,809.39 saw receipts totaling \$4,055 and disbursements totaling \$1,118.93 for a current balance of **\$12,745.46**. Most of the receipts were from Golf Outing sponsors and golfers; notable outflows included \$1,000 transferred to the Church Fund for the balance owed to St. John Neumann for the Pieta statue.
- **Church fund:** Beginning balance of \$1,275.31 gained 1 cent interest for a current balance of **\$275,32**. (The \$1,000 for the Pieta statue was transferred in from the General Fund and paid to the church.)
- Scholarship fund: Beginning balance of \$4,492.26 gained 4 cents interest for a current balance of **\$4,492.30**.
- **Relief fund:** Beginning balance of \$3,375.69 gained 3 cents interest for a current balance of **\$3,375.72**.

# **DISTRICT DEPUTY REPORT (John Radicone)**

- **GENERATION LIFE:** Zoom presentation by Faith Schnaak, executive director, Philadelphia-based **Generation Life**: a non-profit Catholic group that **promotes chastity** on junior high, high school and college campuses. Faith called the group's mission "**the preventative maintenance side of the prolife movement**." The group teaches about authentic love and gives young people the tools to find it. The group has made presentations in our area at Lancaster Catholic High School and St. Leo the Great. Faith made two requests of the council:
  - (1) Financial support so it can serve as many students as possible.
    Financial support is the organization's greatest need to help pay gas and tolls for its speakers. She requested an annual gift so the group can put it in its budget. Dick Reehling, thinking of the Golf Outing, asked how much. Answer: "Around \$1,000 would be wonderful." The Grand Knight

noted this is a big ask, adding that "I'm sure they'd be happy with anything they can get" from the council. Noted it's a Catholic organization with zero overhead (board of directors is unpaid) with a mission that aligns with our values as Knights.

- (2) Provide contacts at schools to which the group can take its message. The organization works to offer young-adult speakers as close to the ages of their audience as possible. Bernadette, who just graduated college, also spoke during the meeting and said her message to students is that they are made in the image and likeness of God and are therefore worthy of authentic love. John Radicone said he would give her contact information for St. John Neumann School.
